



Tips for an Efficient Clinic

1. The nurse will need a private or semi-private area with a desk or table, two chairs and a garbage can.
2. Please have the participants lined up for maximum efficiency.
3. Workers should have their questionnaires filled out before seeing the nurse.
4. It would be helpful if you could facilitate keeping the lineup full so the nurse does not have big gaps of down time.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. The flu vaccine is an inactive (killed) virus; therefore, it cannot cause the flu.
2. Allergic reactions are extremely rare. The nurse brings emergency supplies to treat an allergic reaction if it should occur.
3. Minor “reactions” to the vaccine are normal, however participants are encouraged to phone the nurse at HEALTHSERV to discuss any symptoms lasting more than three days.
4. We will not leave any needles behind. The nurse takes all biohazard waste away to dispose of properly.
5. The actual time with the nurse is about one minute for each person.
6. The participant needs to wait for 10 minutes as a general precaution against allergic reaction to the vaccine but does not need to wait in the presence of the nurse. As long as they do not leave the building, going back to work is fine.

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
